We stand in solidarity with Black and minoritised individuals, communities, and organisations. We do not claim to speak on their behalf but act as allies in the fight against racism. We acknowledge that racism exists everywhere, including within our own sector and movement. Racism, racial injustice, and systemic inequality are deeply intertwined with patriarchy, imperialism, and white supremacy.
