Lincolnshire Rape Crisis has been delivering specialist therapeutic services across Lincolnshire since 2013, supporting adults and children as a trusted sector expert.

This is an established, high-quality service, providing consistent, specialist therapeutic support for survivors of sexual violence across the county.

Our service is funded by the Ministry of Justice (MoJ) and accredited by Rape Crisis England & Wales (RCEW), ensuring delivery to nationally recognised standards of safety, quality and survivor-centred practice.

Our role is to provide specialist therapeutic expertise while strengthening partnership working and improving outcomes for survivors.

We work collaboratively with a wide range of partners to ensure a coordinated, trauma-informed response for survivors.

- **Lincolnshire Police**
- **CAMHS and wider mental health services**
- **Probation services**
- **Education settings, including schools and colleges**
- **Victim support services and wider third sector organisations**

- **Safeguarding processes and multi-agency risk management**
- **Information sharing to support safe, effective care planning**
- **Joined-up pathways from crisis through to long-term recovery**

- Development of coping strategies and emotional resilience
- Support paced around individual needs and readiness
- Consistent, longer-term support for recovery

ISVA support for adult victims of sexual violence in Lincolnshire

From April 2026, Lincolnshire Rape Crisis will be commissioned to deliver the Lincolnshire Adults ISVA Service – an expansion of our already successful ISVA provision across the county.

This enhanced service provides independent, specialist advocacy for adults (18+) affected by sexual violence.

Our ISVAs are fully independent from the police, ensuring survivors receive impartial, confidential support alongside the criminal justice process.

Working towards Lime Culture-accreditation and an achieving Rape Crisis England & Wales accredited provider, we deliver services to nationally recognised standards of quality, safety, governance and survivor-centred practice.

Crisis counselling support for victims of sexual violence in Lincolnshire

From April 2026, Lincolnshire Rape Crisis will deliver specialist SARC Crisis Counselling, providing immediate, trauma-informed emotional support to adults following sexual violence.

This represents an expansion of our established specialist provision, strengthening the support available at the earliest point of need.

Our service complements SARC pathways, ensuring people presenting in crisis receive timely, compassionate and professional emotional support alongside forensic and medical care.

As a Rape Crisis England & Wales accredited provider, we deliver services to nationally recognised standards of quality, safety and survivor-centred practice.

A new era of specialist SARC crisis counselling

We work collaboratively with SARC specialists; PHL, to ensure a coordinated, responsive, and survivor-centred approach.

Our partnership model supports:

- ✓ Immediate access to crisis counselling for people presenting at the SARC in crisis
- ✓ Clear communication and defined professional roles
- ✓ Seamless integration with forensic and medical care
- ✓ Consistent support from crisis through to recovery
- ✓ Strengthened multi-agency safeguarding and support pathways



WHAT THIS MEANS FOR SURVIVORS IN LINCOLNSHIRE

Referrals come directly from people presenting in crisis at the SARC, enabling responsive access to specialist emotional support when it is needed most.



Our SARC Crisis Counselling service offers:

- Immediate emotional stabilisation at the point of crisis
- Support to feel safe, heard and believed
- Reduced distress following SARC attendance
- Help to understand options following trauma
- Support for informed decision-making
- Improved continuity of care and onward support
